- Current award is to continue Geriatrics
 Workforce Enhancement Program

Virginia Geriatric Education Center

- EVMS Medicare Wellness Visit program and Social Determinants of Health at two primary care clinics in Tidewater
- Richmond Health and Wellness Program at 5 HUD-rental assistance sites, with VCU pre-clinical students
- Project ECHO, microlearning, Virginia Navigator, Senior Mentoring, ADRD, etc


Road Scholar and Lifelong Learning Programs: 2019

- 18 Road Scholar programs, with 437 older learners
- Our sites:
 - Big Meadows
 - Harrisonburg
 - Richmond
 - Staunton
- \$537,300+ into Virginia's economy from older learners (from tuition revenues and discretionary spending by learners)
- Outlays: \$258,000 for lodging/meals; \$23,000 local staffing; \$30,000 for tickets/admissions, \$9,000 for transport, etc.

Road Scholar and Lifelong Learning Programs: 2019

- Lifelong Learning Institute (LLI), Midlothian
 - Co-sponsored with Chesterfield County
- 752 (745 in 2018) classes/events across 3 terms
- 25,084 (24,632) registrations; 50 (46) zip codes
- 3,026 (2,965) student enrollments
- 1,517 (1,358) mid-life and older learners
- **220** (221) instructors
- 1,954 mid-life and older learners overall in the Road Scholar and LLI programs in 2019

Abuse in Later Life (ALL)

- Abuse in Later Life Project (DCJS 2019-2021)
 - Statewide focus on both family and intimate partner abuse in later life
 - Training for criminal justice professionals, APS, DV advocates, aging-related service providers, emergency communications, and allied professionals on interagency collaboration, traumainformed response to ALL
 - Training also at executive and supervisory levels
 - Central Virginia Task Force on Domestic Violence in Later Life:
 - Regional collaboration
 - Membership now 182 allied professionals (up 20%)

Abuse in Later Life

- Central Virginia Task Force on Domestic Violence in Later Life (continued):
 - 10 site visits and consultations
 - 5 training sessions in Central Virginia
- Training of Law Enforcement Officers
 - 3 one-day training sessions (Martinsville, Harrisonburg, Richmond) for 101 officers, magistrates, and other professionals
- Supervisors Training Curriculum
 - Started developing new on-line curriculum; field-testing in 2020
- □Pilot Training for National Clearinghouse on Abuse in Later Life

Research

- Alzheimer's and Related Diseases Research Award Fund (ARDRAF)
 - Seed grants to enable Virginia researchers to obtain data needed to compete nationally for substantial awards from federal and foundation sources
 - Repeated follow ups of ARDRAF awardees to determine impact of their ARDRAF pilot studies over time

Alzheimer's Research (ARDRAF) since 1982 go.vcu.edu/ardraf

- 186 competitive seed grant awards
- 26 recipient organizations
- Average award @ \$25,753
- \$4.79 Million competitively awarded
- \$44.2 Million in subsequent funding earned by awardees attributable
- A \$9.22 return for every \$1.00 GF

ARDRAF: 6 Awards in 2019

(UVA, VCU, VCUHS-Shenandoah Family Practice Residency, Carilion Medical Center)

- UVA: molecular and behavioral outcomes of toxicity spead in AD mouse model
- UVA: cardiac surgery post-operative EEG changes accompanying delirium and dementia
- VCU: preclinical biomarkers of risk and resilience that may contribute to Mild Cognitive Impairment
- VCU: factors involved in prevention of AD in lowincome, housing-subsidized elders with diabetes or cardiovascular symptoms

ARDRAF: 6 Awards in 2019

- Shenandoah Valley Family Practice Residency: demographic factors (e.g., ethnicity, geography, population density) that influence reduced use of antipsychotics to treat behavioral and psychological symptoms of dementia
- Carilion: non-pharmacological intervention using machine learning to detect triggers of dementiarelated agitation

- Age in Action quarterly (20,000+ circulation)
- Area Planning and Services
 Committee (APSC) on aging with lifelong disabilities
- Advisory and research translation with dozens of community agencies and coalitions, e.g., East End Coalition


In meeting our mandates, we did business or partnered in aging-related projects with:
